James Chester Olds, named after his maternal grandfather, was affectionately referred to as "Chester" by his family and friends. He was born on November 12, 1954, in Norfolk, Virginia. On February 14, 2021, he transitioned from this earthly life to eternal life with the God and Father who created him.

Chester, the eldest of eight children, attended Diggs Park Elementary School in Norfolk, Virginia, before his family relocated to Washington, D.C., in 1963. He continued his education in the District of Columbia Public Schools, namely Watkins and Buchanan Elementary School, Eliot Junior High School, and Cardozo Senior High School. While at Eliot Junior High, Chester excelled at playing the drums, guitar, and piano. At Cardozo, he was valedictorian of his graduating class.

After graduating high school, Chester joined the United States Army. Upon leaving the military, he found employment with Western Union. He later obtained an electrician license, and he and his brothers, Le Verne and Julius, opened Olds General Contractors, a business that served many apartment complexes in Southern Maryland. The entrepreneurs operated the business for years until Le Verne began to experience health challenges. For nearly 20 years, Chester worked at BioReliance Pharmaceutical Company in Rockville, Maryland, in the Biopharmaceutical Services Branch as a technical engineer.

Chester, a man of faith, accepted the Lord Jesus Christ at an early age. In 2010, he rededicated his life to the Lord, and joined From the Heart Church Ministries during a Family Day service.

Chester loved his family, especially his mother, Melbert. Moreover, he enjoyed attending family gatherings—like the numerous cookouts, and the annual McLean family reunions. He loved to visit with family members, always leaving them with kind words of encouragement and a heartfelt "I love you." He was always accessible to his family, saying "I'm approachable...after I've had my coffee." As the eldest child, Chester cared for each of his siblings by imparting wisdom and providing guidance during their "special" one-on-one talks. Additionally, he encouraged everyone to trust God in the tough times, and shared his favorite poem, "Footprints in the Sand" to uplift them.

On May 15, 2015, Chester met and subsequently married, Doris, whom he lovingly called his "special lady." They were like two peas in a pod—made for each other—she called him "baby" no matter where they were.

Chester's hobbies included playing chess, and bike riding. Later in life, he began sketching, and drawing images of various people in group settings. Chester, with his giving heart, enjoyed distributing clothes and blankets to the homeless; and providing food for the hungry. He will be dearly missed by all who knew and loved him.

Chester leaves to cherish his memory his wife, Doris Olds; mother, Melbert O. Johnson; sisters: Deborah Shell (Joe), Sharon Watkins (Dewey III), Dawn Reney (Stephen), Wendy Zuber (Michael); brother, Julius Olds; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives; and friends.

Chester was preceded in death by his stepfather, William F. Johnson; brothers, Larry Olds and Le Verne Olds; and grandmother, Varie Lee Pritchard.


