Born Louise Marjorie Acolatse in Liberia, she insisted on the spelling "Louyse" and later was simply called Marjorie at work and church. Lou, as she was called by family and dear old friends, was the third of four children (Florence, Joachim, Jr., Louyse, and Barbara) produced from the marriage of Edna Victoria Brown and Joachim P. C. Acolatse, Sr., both now deceased.

During childhood, Lou and her younger sister moved to Washington, D.C., to live with their mother and stepfather, the late Abraham Massalley, a Liberian diplomat. She delighted in riding her bike and exploring the area with her ever-present Kodak camera. Later, at Theodore Roosevelt High School, track and field became her passion, and after taking driver education she ached for that driver's license. She took pride in navigating the DMV area; however, if ever lost while driving or walking, Lou never admitted it. Post high school, she dabbled in accounting and photography before a love of technology led to a degree in computer science.

Lou with her quick smile and spontaneous humor easily engaged in conversation with anyone. In fact, she drew strength from people and crowds. Her younger nieces and nephews relished her attention and outings with them. Additionally, she enjoyed amusement parks, traveling, parades, athletic and political events, and volunteering. Lou was always ready to lend a helping hand or idea throughout her life.

In 1985, Lou married her loving, devoted husband Kenneth A. Foreman, and was widowed in February of 2004. They both became members of From the Heart Church Ministries in 1992. There, they found renewed strength and commitment. Both Lou and Ken were faithful and enthusiastic members of the Transportation Ministry at the church. Lou later became head of that ministry. She was also active in other ministries to include Sick and Shut-in, Health and Recovery, Community Outreach, and Intercessory Prayer. Moreover, her involvement in her church was tended carefully, lovingly, and tirelessly—From the Heart became her other family. And her respect for the late Dr. John A. Cherry and his wife, Reverend Diana P. Cherry was only second to that of President Barack and Michelle Obama.

Another family are the people at McLean School in Potomac, Maryland, where Lou was employed for the past 20 years. In March, she was honored with an expertly executed virtual, Zoom Memorial that was extraordinary in its message of love and loss. Additionally, a buddy bench, and brick stone on the walkway have been dedicated to her memory by colleagues, faculty, staff, management, students, and parents of McLean School.

Though extremely private about her personal life, Lou nevertheless led an active, people-centered, and inspiring life which was reflected in her commitment and service to her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ as well as her service to others. She will be greatly missed by all who knew and loved her.

Lou leaves to cherish her memory her close and extended relatives including the Acolatse, Brown, Coleman, Dennis, Foreman, Massalley, and Moulton families; her many friends, especially Denise Felix -Silva, her longest and dearest friend; and siblings who will always love and protect her in their hearts, Frances E. Moulton Witherspoon, Florence C. Acolatse Macauley, Joachim P. C. Acolatse, Jr., (Tanae), Barbara V. Acolatse Coleman (Douglas), and Abraham Massalley (Karen).
