Ahaz Harold Milam, (affectionately known as Hal), was born On May 4, 1933, to the late Lawrence and Mary Milam in Greenville, SC. He departed this life to be with the Lord on September 29, 2021, after a long illness at his home in Upper Marlboro, Md. He was the fourth of twelve children. Three brothers, Wade Milam, Lawrence Milam, Jr. (Bill), Marshall Milam, and three sisters, Willie Mae, Elijah Lee and Martha Ruth preceded him in death.

Hal entered into holy matrimony with the love of his life, Marion C. Milam, and for 44 years they built a life of service in their church and dedication to family and friends. As a surrogate father to many in his spear of influence, Hal provided love and support to many, including children and stepchildren. He demonstrated care and concern for neighborhood friends with whom his son Jay surrounded himself. He provided love and support to many, primarily to Jeffrey and Russell, who predeceased him; and Greg, Adrian, Sharon, and Gale until they were of majority age. They went their separate ways, living successful lives, which was his wish and prayer. He also leaves to mourn his passing, a very special son, Steven C., with whom he shared a special bond of love and closeness.

Hal was educated in the primary and secondary public schools of Greenville, South Carolina, where he excelled in vocational endeavors and was an extraordinary basketball player, a skill that seemed to run in his family. His mom, dad and entire immediate family all moved to the Washington, DC area in the early 1960s, and many continues to reside in the MDV area.

Upon arriving in Washington, DC, Hal began a lifelong career with the local telephone companies; and has worked in various capacities for AT&T, C&P Telephone Co., Bell Atlantic and retired from Verizon after 35 years of service. He was a pioneer in his field, being the first African American to gain status as a telephone lineman, repairer, installer and communications technical engineer. He received many accolades and commendations during his years of work. After his retirement, he started his own communications business, which he ran for another 15 years.

During this period, he was also busy raising and coaching his son, Jay, in school sports, in ROTC drills, and carpooled him to all his extracurricular activities, where Jay excelled in swimming and won trophies and honorable mentions at regional swim meets and martial arts tournaments. Hal's main goal was to ensure his son's success and to keep him away from the negative influences of his time. After Jay's graduation from high school in 1997; Hal devoted the rest of his life to his beloved wife. They loved to travel, and both were actively involved in church ministries. For example, Membership Care, Nursing Ministries as well as Men's and Women of God Lifegivers' Fellowships and retreats. Hal, Marion and Jay joined Full Gospel AME Zion Church in 1988, now known as "From the Heart Church Ministries[®]" under the leadership of the late Episcopal Pastor John Cherry. They have never veered from the faith since that time.

Hal was also a 33rd degree Mason; and upon learning that he had to relinquish his membership, he followed the authority of his church. He was a man of faith and conviction; and prayer was his first order of the day. He would always say when confronted with life issues, "let me take a walk and talk to God, and when I get back, I'll have the answer." And he always did!

In addition to his loyal and loving wife, Marion, and devoted sons, Jay (SeLinda) and Steven (Theresa), Harold leaves to mourn his passing; brothers Elder John Milam, Paul Milam (Ruth), and Randolph Milam; sisters, Alice Kyle and Lenora Thompson; brothers in law George Crawford (Annette) and Terry Crawford, sisters in law Maxine O'Neal and Annie Crawford; and a host of other relatives, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins and lifelong friends.
