Obituary

David Tyrone Adams was born on August 8, 1947, in Washington D.C. He was the eldest of six children born to the late David and Marion Adams. He was educated in the Atlanta Public Schools, attending Slater Elementary School, and graduating from Price High School, class of 1965.

In 1966, David returned to the District, where he lived with his grandparents, Lester, and Juanita Pitts. Moreover, he met Brenda Seay whom he married on August 12, 1974. Several years later, on December 9, 1977, the couple was blessed with their only child, daughter, Wendi Jenise.

David was employed with the Federal Government for some years before working as a printing press operator at the University of the District of Columbia where he retired after 30 years of dedicated service. After retirement, he worked for ten years as a security gate attendant for Southern Management; and ended his lengthy career as a an Uber driver.

David (Tyrone and TI to his siblings, family, and friends in Atlanta) loved his family dearly. And he was many things to many people—a loving, devoted husband—a loving, supportive father, and a big brother. Furthermore, he was always willing to listen and give advice—a caring, attentive and loving papa to grandsons, Maurice and Masia, a loving son, and uncle—and finally, a true friend.

David was an avid sports fan who loved football and the former Washington Redskins. However, the Atlanta Falcons also held a special place in his heart. Additionally, for many years he enjoyed officiating for the Youth Sports Football League.

In 1994, David gave his life to Jesus Christ and joined From the Heart Church Ministries under the leadership of Founding Pastor John A. Cherry. He was a faithful member of the church for more than 25 years; and was a true man of God who gave of himself in many ways to everyone he met.

On Friday, June 18, 2021, God in His infinite wisdom dispatched an angel to David and said, “You fought a good fight, you finished your course, and you kept the faith. Come on home.” Moreover, David touched the hearts of many and was a true blessing to all who knew him. He will truly be missed, but never ever forgotten.

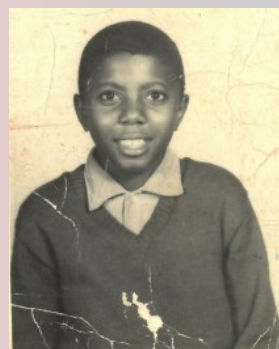
