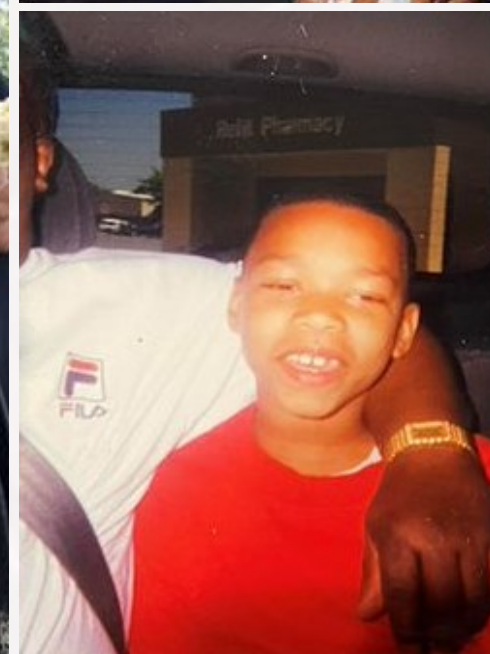

In 2009, he graduated from Surrattsville High School in Clinton, Maryland. After high school, Victor moved to California and began working for the Italian fashion house, Moschino, as a personal stylist. He loved to shop, and his passion for fashion was very evident. Through his travels between New York City and Los Angeles, Victor was able to rub elbows with many well-known entertainers.

Victor really enjoyed being with family and friends; and was extremely supportive of those he loved. Furthermore, he was giving, straightforward, and confident—not bothered by the opinions of others. The impressively dressed young man used his bold personality to command attention. And as the life of the party, the dance floor was his stage.

In 2018, Victor was diagnosed with leukemia and sadly lost his battle with the cancer three years later. He always believed in living life to the fullest and lived each day like it was his last.
