Obituary

Robin Shirita Davis was born to Shirlean Davis and Aaron D. Davis on June 8, 1960, in Cheverly, Maryland. She went home to be with the Lord on January 16, 2022.

Robin was educated in the Prince George's County Public Schools, and in 1978 she graduated from Central High School in Capitol Heights, Maryland. She furthered her studies at Strayer University majoring in business administration.

Robin was a hardworking woman who held several jobs. However, her employment with the Prince George's County Police Department and the U.S. Postal Service (USPS) had the biggest impact on her career. She worked for the Police Department for nearly a decade before finding employment with the USPS. And she retired from the U.S. Postal Inspection Service, the law enforcement arm of the USPS, after 31 years of dedicated service.

Robin loved God, life, family, traveling, and shopping. She gave her life to Jesus Christ, and subsequently joined From the Heart Church Ministries in February 1996 under the leadership of Founding Pastor, John A. Cherry. She remained a member there until her passing.

Moreover, Robin loved children although she only had one child, a son, Anthony. She looked forward to her weekly visits with him and her beautiful granddaughters, Olivia, and Naima. They brought her immense joy. Furthermore, Robin loved family time and family gatherings. She was resourceful—always ready to lend a helping hand—proofreading documents, sharing home decor ideas, giving neutral advice, and more. In her leisure she enjoyed reading, putting jigsaw puzzles together, and watching episodes of Perry Mason.

Incidentally, Robin had a way of making people feel good about spending their money. And somehow her shopping cart always contained fewer items than everyone else's. Shopping and having lunch with her sister were a Saturday favorite; it is something her family will surely cherish.

Robin will be remembered for her wisdom, kindness, and, of course, her beautiful smile. To have known her was to have loved her.

Robin is survived by her son, Anthony (Janelle) Davis; granddaughters, Olivia Davis and Naima Davis; her mother, Shirlean Davis; sisters: Andrea (Lorenzo) Duncan, Vicky (Andrew) Clark, and Pamela (Jemal) Henson; brothers: Duranta (Tina) Davis, Marvin (Pam) Davis, and Andre (Angela) Davis; godchildren, Michael Matthews and Indya Woodfolk. She also leaves behind a host of nieces, nephews, and great friends.
