Rodney Wilson Duckett was born on November 22, 1946, in Washington, D.C., to Wilson and Thelma Duckett. He was the fourth of five children. Rodney peacefully transitioned at MedStar Southern Maryland Hospital Center on March 24, 2022.

The native Washingtonian and his siblings grew up in their parents' Northwest, Washington home. He also attended D.C. Public Schools where he received a high school diploma. After high school, he worked at the Library of Congress for a few years. And on August 24, 1966, Rodney enlisted in the U.S. Army serving his country for almost two years before being honorably discharged from the military. He was last employed with D.C.'s Blue Plains Advanced Wastewater Treatment Plant as a water technician and retired after thirty years of dedicated service.

Rodney was an avid reader which was his passion; however, he also enjoyed drawing, building model airplanes, and watching TV, especially Western movies. Additionally, he was a fan of the National Football League, the National Basketball Association as well as collegiate sports.

On October 3, 1997, Rodney married the love of his life, Paulette Smith. Love truly was the foundation for their marriage—they loved each other through thick and thin—for better and for worse, committed until death. For the past seven years, the couple had been raising their great-granddaughter, Desirae Johnson. Rodney loved and adored Desirae; and would faithfully pick her up from the bus stop after school. Once home, the two would play games, draw, and of course, read. Rodney and Paulette, affectionately known as "Papa" and "Nana," were committed to bringing up Desirae in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

Rodney a man of faith, joined From the Heart Church Ministries in 2010. He was actively involved in the life of the church, namely the Nursing and Seniors Ministries. With Rodney by her side, Paulette had joined From the Heart years prior. And at age seven, during a service there, Desirae accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior.
