On April 26, 2022, *Monica Denise Smith-Clark*, a beloved wife, mother, sister, aunt, confidant, comforter, nurturer, and friend to all, transitioned to her new home.

Monica, affectionately known as "Moni," was born on April 16, 1964, to Henrietta and Lee Smith in Washington, D.C. She was educated in the District of Columbia Public Schools graduating from Duke Ellington School for the Performing Arts in 1982. Subsequently, she attended Shenandoah University where she graduated with a bachelor's degree in arts in 1986, the first person in her family to do so.

Her career path began with DC YouthWorks. After college, Monica worked for the Armed Forces Benefits Association, and the American Statistical Association as a meeting coordinator where she was given the opportunity to travel around the country, sometimes accompanied by her family, for various conferences and meetings. Her final place of employment was the Government of the District of Columbia's Alcohol Beverage Regulation Administration where she worked up until the week before she transitioned.

In 2001, Monica met the love of her life, David L. Clark, Jr. The couple married two years later and from their union she inherited a son, David L. Clark, III—and their younger son, Devin, was born.

On September 11, 2005, the virtuous woman of God joined From the Heart Church Ministries where she remained a faithful member until her passing.

Further, Monica deeply loved and believed in demonstrating that love through her actions. She was always concerned about others; and everything she did was from the heart whether it was a handwritten birthday card, a crocheted hat, scarf, or blanket and even a painting. Monica's love for the arts was ever present in her everyday life. She freely gave of herself and believed in the importance of family while taking her responsibilities as a wife, mother, aunt, cousin, and godmother very seriously.
