Obituary

Marie Roberta Cousins was born on December 21, 1957, to the late Wilbert H. Cousins, Sr. and the late Almeda N. Cousins in Richmond, VA. Marie answered God's call to Eternal Rest on December 27, 2022. She was not afraid because she had a long, fulfilling relationship with Him that assured her that she would no longer suffer from the troubles and cares of life on Earth. She was predeceased by brothers, Ronald B., Tyrone and Vernon B. Cousins, Sr.

EDUCATION

Marie received her formal childhood education through the Richmond Public Schools. She was a 1976 graduate of Maggie L.Walker High School, where she was an excellent student and a cheerleader for the Mighty Green Dragons. Upon graduation, she matriculated to Fisk University, Nashville, TN, earning a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science, *Magna Cum Lau*de. She was determined not to delay her career in Public Administration; therefore, she gave up her summer vacation and enrolled in Penn State University, University Park, PA. She earned a Master's Degree in Advanced Study in Public Administration.

CHRISTIAN JOURNEY

Marie began her Christian Journey at Fifth Baptist Church in 1964. She accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Savior and was baptized in 1965. She attended Sunday School and Baptist Training Union regularly. She sang in the Cherubim Choir and the Mass Choir. Marie and three close friends formed a gospel group called The Jaynettes. She was active in the Youth Organization and the Girl Scouts, where she earned a Service Badge, and a two-weeks' stay at a camp in New Mexico. Also, Marie traveled to Haiti to do mission work. On her return to Richmond following college, she began exploring non-denominational churches. She joined The Richmond Christian Center, where she sang in the choir. In 2011, she later joined From the Heart Church Ministries of Richmond. In September 2013, she transferred her membership to From the Heart Church Ministries Parent Church, located in Suitland, Maryland. This allowed Marie because of many factors, including health and safety, to live in Northern Virginia during the week and most weekends. She was actively involved in the life of the church and served in the Activities Ministry. Working with other Activity Ministry volunteers, she helped to identify, plan, and coordinate local church activities, as well as provided support to the Office of the Pastor and other ministries in carrying out events and programs.

EMPLOYMENT

Marie had an illustrious career as a federal public servant with the Social Security Administration (SSA). Marie strived and gave her very best every day for the public she served for over 31 years. Marie began her career as a claim representative in the Fredericksburg, VA, SSA Office, and then transferred to the Richmond (East) VA office. After sharpening her knowledge and skills

in the local offices, she accepted a Social Insurance Specialist (Analyst) position in Appellate Operations (OAO) in Falls Church, VA. This Division processes and reviews cases at the administrative appeal/court level. She continued to serve the public and expanded her SSA knowledge and experience as she moved forward, becoming a mentor to OAO newly hired employees, a Technical Assistant providing research to co-workers, managers, and administrative law judges. Marie then became a Branch Chief in OAS's Disability Branch, and then the Division of Civil Action, her last step before retirement in 2018. Marie found and made many friends in SSA, and they could count on her support, even after retirement.

INTERESTS AND HOBBIES

Marie's interests and hobbies had no boundaries. Upon retirement, it appeared that she had interests that had been waiting to be released. She became an accomplished cook for family and friends, and a gardener (who knew she had a green thumb). One can imagine that hiking was a flashback from her girl scout training. She loved reading, singing, and became the 'Entertainer' during family functions, teaching the children how to cheer, impromptu fashion and household goods shows featuring her finds from estate sales, vintage shops, thrift stores, and antique shops. Marie loved her Jackson Ward community. She was a member of the Historic Jackson Ward Association, the Genealogical Society of Greater Richmond Virginia Chapter, the Black History Museum and Culture Center of Virginia, and the Virginia Museum of History and Culture.


