Obituary

Geraldine "Geri" Jones was born in Chicago, Illinois, on March 5, 1942, to the late Dorothy Simms and William McKinnie. She passed away on August 10, 2023.

Raised in Chicago, Geri graduated from Farragut High School in 1960. She furthered her education by completing several dietician courses at City College of Chicago. In 1973, she relocated to nearby Park Forest, Illinois, and began working as a consultant for the Mary Kay Cosmetic Company and a district manager for Proctor and Gamble several years later.

In 1961, she married Herman Grant, Jr. in Chicago. The couple was blessed with two daughters, Mikki and Donna.

Geri relocated to Fort Washington, Maryland, in 1990 and started a new career as a planning consultant at Fort Lincoln Cemetery where she worked from 1992 to 1996.
