**Beverly Arnetta Bulluck** was born on October 17, 1956, in Laurel, Delaware, to the late Norris Oscar Brown and Esther Virginia Brown. She departed this life on January 2, 2024.

Beverly affectionately called "Bev," was the middle child, she had an older sister, Lynn, and a younger brother, Eric. She grew up in Upper Marlboro, Maryland, and was educated in Prince George's County Public Schools. In 1974, after graduating from Frederick Douglass Senior High School, Beverly wanted to join the Air Force; however, her father and mother both encouraged her to attend college instead. Consequently, Beverly pursued a college education at Bowie State University (formerly Bowie State College) and graduated in 1979 with a Bachelor of Science in Art Education.

While in college, Beverly worked with the Upward Bound Program as an arts and crafts instructor, an office assistant, and a hostess for art shows in the Art Department. Beverly originally wanted to be a fashion designer, but one of her professors suggested that her personality was better suited for teaching.

Beverly began her career as an art teacher at Kenmoor Junior High School in Landover, Maryland. She subsequently worked for two years in sales for Sears Department Store. After working at Sears, she decided to return to teaching. She taught grades K3-K5 and was an aftercare supervisor at From the Heart Christian School (formerly Full Gospel Christian School) in Temple Hills, Maryland. While working in aftercare, she met the love of her life, Eric Bulluck.

Moreover, Beverly spent a year at First Adventure Early Learning Center in Cheverly, Maryland, teaching grade K-5 and supervising aftercare; and four years at the National Christian Academy in Fort Washington, Maryland, teaching first and second grades. She got her greatest joy from teaching the students Christian songs during devotions and teaching Bible stories with her Abeka Photo Cards. From 1997 to 2023, she taught kindergarten through second grade and later was a K-4 teacher assistant at New Chapel Christian Academy in Camp Springs, Maryland. Additionally, she wrote New Chapel's former school song titled, "Disciple Makers." She said that God gave her the vision and the words.

In the 1980s, Beverly accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior and joined From the Heart Church Ministries at its storefront location. On September 13, 1986, she married Eric "Rick" Clayton Bulluck whom she had met several years earlier. Together the couple raised his children, Eric "Ricky" Bulluck, II and Chanteshea Bulluck; and from their union they had one daughter, Christina Marie Bulluck. Beverly faithfully served in the Office Support Ministry at From the Heart.

Beverly enjoyed watching musicals or nature programs, watching figure skating and tennis on television, relaxing at home, getting Ledo's Pizza on the weekends, buying a Mounds or Almond Joy candy bar for herself— she would share most of the time. She loved anything with coconut and would regularly get a slice of coconut cream pie from the store. She liked sweets and would bring home any left-over goody bags from students' birthday parties. Beverly was always asked to bring sweet potato pie or potato salad to holiday gatherings, and she made her pies the way her husband liked, "without nutmeg!" In fact, she never used a recipe—she would taste as she cooked and would ask her husband and youngest daughter to be her taste testers. She also enjoyed oil painting, sewing, singing, arts and crafts and making decorations for her many classrooms.

As a child, Beverly enjoyed playing outside with her friends: Tony, Gene, Pia, Susan "Sue," and her siblings on Old Mill Road. They would camp outside at night, play hide-in-seek until it got dark, they even built a go-cart that would hold all seven of them and ride down the hill together, picture that. And when the pond froze during the winter, they would walk across it or even try skating on it. They were adventurous during their childhood years, but what fun they had.

Beverly was a sentimental woman who often kept greeting cards received from her family on birthdays and Mother's Day; and she kept many of the Christmas ornaments that her daughter, Christina, made as a child. Her children's friends always enjoyed talking to her and considered her easy to talk to.

While those who knew and loved Beverly will miss her beautiful smile, they will also miss the unwavering support she freely gave to those she loved. She leaves to cherish her memory her daughter, Christina M. Bulluck; daughter-in-love, Chanelle Reddrick; grandchildren: Charles Smith, Tiana Smith and Drue Lawrence; great-grandchildren, Jalen Chan and Camellia Chan; mother, Esther W. Brown; sister, Lynn C. Brown; brother, Eric G. Brown; sisters-in-law, Danielle Brown and Ivy Bulluck; brothers-in-law, Adrian Bulluck and Leon McKenzie; and many nieces, nephews, other relatives, and friends.

In addition to her father, Beverly was preceded in death by her son, Eric Clayton Bulluck, II; her husband of nearly 30 years, Eric Clayton Bulluck; and daughter, Chanteshea Theresa Bulluck.
