

Dwight L. Mitchell, the second son of four sons of the late Florence L. Mitchell and Marshall Mitchell was born in Wilson, North Carolina on April 20, 1947.

Dwight received his early education in the District of Columbia Public School System. In 1963, he was employed with the Fort Myer Army Military Base in Arlington, Virginia. Dwight enlisted in the U. S. Army on August 31, 1965 and was honorably discharged on August 30, 1968. His military service included a year in Vietnam. Dwight received several campaign and service awards; to include an expert badge for the use of the M14 rifle. After his military service, he re-enlisted in the U. S. Army Reserve and was discharged on August 30, 1971. Dwight continued his education at American University.

Dwight was also employed with the Railroad Express Agency, Inc. and the federal government's General Service Administration. However, he patiently waited for the job that he truly desired-a police officer with the District of Columbia Metropolitan Police Department (MPD). On March 1, 1970, his desire was realized when he joined the Department. Dwight absolutely loved his job. He made many friends and was a jokester which probably resulted in a few enemies. Dwight worked in the 2nd District as a patrol officer, and as a Detective in the 1st District Narcotics Unit. He also worked at the Criminal Investigation Division (Sex Offense Branch) and the Office of Internal Affairs. His friendship with many of his fellow officers established very close family relationships which are still thriving today. He retired from MPD on June 4, 1993. Dwight missed the camaraderie with his brothers and sisters in the MPD and entered the Senior Officers Program where he worked for many years. Upon officially retiring from the MPD, Dwight joined the National Institute of Health Police Department in 2003 as a detective and retired in 2012. He was later employed with the National Museum of Women in the Arts from 2015 to 2021.

On August 7, 1983, Dwight and Adrianne accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior and were baptized at the Church of Christ-Southeast in Suitland MD. They were married on March 17, 1984, after a 12 year friendship and their children were blended as one family. Dwight experienced all the benefits of being raised in a Christian family. He always spoke of how his grandmother had weekly Bible study sessions where she taught about Jesus. In 1985, the family joined From the Heart Church Ministries where Dwight faithfully served in the Usher, Repast, and the Special Services ministries. Special Services was his favorite ministry, he enjoyed "Standing on the Wall"! Dwight was one of the first members to be selected for the Special Services Ministry. Dwight played an integral role in recruiting younger men to join the ministry. Dwight dutifully performed his assignments until October 2023.

Dwight enjoyed the beauty of life and was ever so grateful for God's gift of life. He especially enjoyed reading, discussing and sharing God's Word, sharing his time, speaking a kind word or doing a deed for his family and friends. He loved his horses, Sundearta and Niya, and training Vida and Sherlock, his Akita dogs.

Moreover, Dwight was a man who lived and shared his treasured faith in his thoughtfulness for the hope field promises of God, especially with his grandchildren. He chose to magnify God rather than discussing his problems or illness - he intentionally made the most of each day. He experienced an abundant life. God took Dwight places and blessed him more than he could ever imagined. One of his greatest joys in life was the fact that God granted him the gift of amazing children and grandchildren who all know the Lord as their Savior. They are kind, well-educated and each of them lives with great integrity. Dwight will be dearly missed by all who knew and loved him. He leaves many precious memories and a fruitful inheritance and his generous and loving demeanor, his willingness to serve others, and the example of his love and obedience to the Lord.

Dwight is survived by his loving and devoted wife, Adrianne; cherished children: Dwayne Mitchell Sr. (Annette), Yvette Mitchell, Monique McDaniel (Derek), Tremia Haythe (Anthony Sr.) and Dionis Williams; brother, Donald Mitchell; 11 precious adult grandchildren, Damien Mitchelle, Marnique Wilson, Joshua Curtis, Omar Floyd, Jaden Williams, Kyra Williams, Kayla Mitchell, Dwayne Mitchell Jr., Anthony Haythe, Jr., Domonique McDaniel and Sanai' Haythe.; great-grandchildren: Milani Garcia, Saint Davis and JaZiah Curtis; goddaughters, Minister Juakena Winston and Kenya Colvin as well as a host of other relatives and friends.


