

Ashley was raised and educated in Prince George's County, Maryland. She graduated from Suitland High School in 2009. One of her most cherished accomplishments while at Suitland High was being accepted into the Visual and Performing Arts (VPA) program. She genuinely loved performing and displaying her artistic abilities. Ashley had a close friend, Brianna Hudson, whom she met through the VPA program; the two developed and maintained a personal relationship with each other to this day. Ashley held administrative positions throughout her career. One of her favorite employment opportunities was being a receptionist at Oxon Hill Senior High School.

Ashley accepted Jesus Christ as her personal Lord and Savior and joined From the Heart Church Ministries in 1993. Her first ministry involvement as a youth was in the Girl Scouts Ministry. As a young adult, she was a member of the Young Adult Choir where she enjoyed ministering in song.

In 2013, Ashley gave birth to her daughter, A'dria Sanai Wilson (whom she affectionately called "Dree"). Dree was the light of her eyes.

Ashley will be remembered as the funny, quick-witted, and beautiful lifegiver that she was. One of the things often said about her was that she was always direct! And she did not play when it came to raising Dree. She would "go hard" as they say about her baby. Ashley loved her family and brought laughter to them and so many others. She was a leader who could, and did, make strangers smile.

Ashley leaves to cherish her memory her daughter, A'dria Wilson; parents, Ellsworth and Sonja Wilson; sisters, Jasmine Wilson and Bianca Joyner (Rapheal); grandmother, Minnie Wilson; godfather, John Maye; and a host of aunts, uncles, cousins, and friends.
