Terry Kelly Honor, affectionately known as "Geno," was born to the late Jacob Kelly Honor and Ruth Glen Honor on April 26, 1957, in Harlem, New York. He was the second child and only son of four children.

Terry attended the New York Public School system where he graduated from Julia Richman High School in 1975. He then matriculated to South Carolina State College, now South Carolina State University, where he was a member of the Bulldog Basketball Team.

Terry served his nation by enlisting in the United States Coast Guard in 1980 and served for four years. This led him to relocate to Baltimore, Maryland, where he completed his military career. Even though he lived in Maryland, his heart was always in New York, and he frequently visited his hometown. His love for guns began as he was trained to be a marksman in the Coast Guard. He could be found at a shooting range almost on a weekly basis and this led him to teach his family and friends how to shoot and use guns safely. He was employed and retired from the DC/VA Department of Corrections after serving twenty-two years. After retiring, he was employed as a security guard at the Ronald Reagan International Trade Center for twelve years.

Terry was married to Sharon Goodwine Honor and to this union the apple of his eye, Sharrone B. Honor was born (the best birthday gift he ever got).

Terry was a lover of God and a dedicated member of From the Heart Church Ministries since 1988, where he faithfully served in the Physical Stewardship Ministry, attended Tuesday Night Bible Study, and rarely missed a Sunday Worship Service.

Moreover, Terry was a sports fanatic, and his favorites were boxing, basketball, track and field, baseball, and soccer. His favorite sports teams were the New York Jets, New York Mets, and the South Carolina State Bulldogs, where he supported and attended all football games. He was also a volunteer for the Special Olympics. His love for sports was so strong that he taught his daughter how to swim, ice skate and roller skate. Terry was so excited when his daughter began running track in middle school. Nothing made him happier than to watch his daughter perform on the track throughout her middle school, high school, and college years. He was still actively engaged in weekly athletic activities such as bike riding, swimming, and ice skating, even though he was retired.

Terry was a jazz enthusiast and listened to it every day. He would also attend various jazz concerts and events. His hobbies included watching Sanford and Son, Westerns, and frequenting the Patapsco Flea Market in Baltimore.

Terry will be cherished and remembered by his loving and devoted daughter, Sharrone Honor; sisters, Sandra Renee Honor and Shawn Ali; nephews: Adam Taylor, Larry Black III, and Matthew Smith; cousin, Sylvia Granger (Art); four grand-nieces and grand-nephews; and a host of other relatives, and friends.

In addition to his parents, Terry was preceded in death by his grandparents, Samuel and Margaret Robinson, and Lessie and Daniel Honor; sister, Margaret Honor; and nephew, Malik Shabazz Ali.
