On August 18, 1947, a beautiful baby girl named Geraldine was born to the late Reverend Arthur and Geneva Chambers Riggins in Havana, Florida. "Gerrie," as she was affectionately called, was the second oldest child of nine born to her parents. She was raised in a home where she and her siblings were taught about the Lord and the biblical principles of Jesus Christ.

Gerrie graduated as an honor student from the former Northside High School (currently Havana Northside High School) in 1965. After graduating high school, she continued her love for learning at Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University and Georgetown University respectively, while pursuing a career within the Federal Government.

Gerrie met and was joined in holy matrimony to Nathaniel S. Washington, Jr. and from this union was blessed with loving daughters, Natalie Sonjanette Washington and Danielle Nicole Washington. The family traveled and lived in various states and eventually settled in Oxon Hill, Maryland.

Gerrie started her career with the Federal Government in 1977 at the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) Immigration Naturalization Service where she worked as a Clerk of the Court until 1983. In February of 1983, Gerrie began working as a Program Analyst with the Department of Justice's Office of Professional Responsibility (OPR). While at OPR, Gerrie assisted with internal investigations and helped Department attorneys perform their duties in accordance with the highest professional standards. She retired from the government after 30 years of dedicated service.

In 1986, Gerrie and her girls joined From the Heart Church Ministries_® where she served faithfully. From 2001 to 2013, she served on the Board of Trustees under the leadership of Dr. John A. Cherry. She was a dedicated member of the Intercessory Prayer Counsel and volunteered in the Intercessory Prayer Ministry. Gerrie also attended the Women of God Lifegivers fellowships and annual retreats.

Gerrie was the family's historian who had recollection of past ancestral happenings. She remembered the origins of her family's roots and recited past anecdotes, painting vivid pictures for all listeners. Gerrie had a love for the English language, spoken and written, and she would often entertain others with tales peppered with details that only a lover of a good story could appreciate.

She lovingly wrote letters of encouragement and comfort to loved ones far and near. Gerrie expressed her love for most in her beautifully crafted and designed "Love Letters." She was a wordsmith who wielded and weaved the sword of the Lord in all the letters she wrote to family, friends, colleagues and even strangers. Gerrie's letters made people imagine being an eyewitness to the stories and experiences she described. Her letters and storytelling provided spiritual insight and answers to questions that had been unspoken. She often ended her letters with, "Love you, from my heart to your heart." In 2024, Gerrie was a contributing author to "Hope In the Waiting," a collection of 40 reflections and prayers for the Lent season.

Gerrie loved to pray, and she spent a considerable amount of time "in her prayer closet" with her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Her prayer life was a testament to her faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and His mighty power as she often proclaimed one of her favorite scriptures, "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us" (Romans 8:18). Gerrie participated in a weekly Bible study group while at DOJ and continued during retirement. In 2020, she became a frequent prayer participant in a weekly virtual-national prayer group known as "Upper Zoom." The Lord used Gerrie to help individuals develop a strong prayer life as she modeled how to seek justice, love mercifully, and walk humbly with God.

Gerrie will be remembered for being steadfastly determined to glorify God in all her ways. On Sunday, June 2, 2024, Gerrie transitioned peacefully and was received up to Glory surrounded by family. She will be dearly missed by all who knew and loved her.

Gerrie leaves to cherish her wonderful memory, her daughters, Natalie Sonjanette and Danielle Nicole; granddaughter, Briana Natasha; great-grandchildren: Jeremiah, Reagan, Nova, and Xavier Jr.; siblings: Annie Chandler, Helen Jones, Cornell (Audrey) Riggins, Kenneth (Cynthia) Riggins, Gwendolyn Crisp, Chappella Riggins, Vann (Shulamith) Riggins, JoAnn Smith, Lester Riggins and Ronnie Riggins; sister-in-law, Sandra Riggins; and a host of extended family members and friends who love her dearly.

Gerrie was preceded in death by her brothers, Dale and John Henry, and brother-in-law, Charles Crisp and other relatives.
