## **OBITUARY**

**ames Edward Penn** was born on March 25, 1949, to the late Edward "Pete" Lee Penn and the late Barbara Louise Penn. James, also known as "Jim" or "Teeny Baby," was the firstborn of nine children.

James grew up on Melon Street in Norfolk, Virginia; and attended Booker T. Washington High School where he was commonly referred to as "The Professor" because of his extensive thirst and love for knowledge and reading.

At the tender age of eighteen, James enlisted in the United States Air Force. His yearslong decorated military career took him from the sunny coasts of California to the pristine islands of Okinawa, Japan. However, his true calling was the Good News Jail and Prison Ministry, a non-profit organization whose mission is to provide spiritually mature, equipped, and motivated Christian chaplains to serve in correctional facilities nationally and internationally. Moreover, as an ordained minister, James dedicated his life to serving God and rehabilitating inmates serving time in detention centers and prisons. He would always say, "Breaking the cycle of crime one life at a time," and "Close the jail gates, don't let anyone get away from the gospel." Deciding that this was his calling, Senior Master Sergeant James Penn retired from the U.S. Air Force after 25 years of service.

Continuing his calling and career with the Good News Jail and Prison Ministry, James rehabilitated, and genuinely impacted hundreds of lives through his work. Furthermore, he continued spreading the uncompromising Word of God through community outreach programs, and local churches; and he inspired countless volunteers to join the Good News Jail and Prison Ministry.

Reverend James Penn was an ordained elder in the house of God. He joined From the Heart Church Ministries (FTH) in 1992 and was actively involved in the life of the ministry. He was a faithful and dedicated member of the Prison Ministry. He will be remembered for his unwavering love for God and his commitment and dedication to serving God's people. His impeccable character and integrity were an inspiration to his co-laborers in the Gospel at FTH.

In addition to his devotion to church and enjoying time spent with family and friends, James was a diehard Washington Commanders (formerly Washington Redskins) fan. And despite their losing seasons, you could always find James sporting his beloved Commanders' blanket, hat, slippers, and anything else that had the team's logo on it. He also loved barbecuing, crabbing, fishing, and dining out often.

James accomplished many amazing things throughout his lifetime; however, his greatest pride in life is the legacy he leaves behind. He was blessed with five children from his first marital union: Ernest, Tracey, Lisa, Matthew, and Martin who preceded him in death several years ago. Through a second marital union with the late Sarah Yvonne Best, he was blessed with bonus children, James and Nikki. In addition to his children, James is survived by seventeen grandchildren; a great-grandchild; and eight siblings: Tony "Anthony," David, Carolyn, Jackie, Debra, Nadine, Junny, and his baby sister, Gwendolyn.

In the loving memory of a dad, brother, husband, granddaddy, great-granddaddy, and friend, James will truly be missed.
