## OBITUARY

Nathaniel A. Brown, Sr., was born on June 1, 1925, to the late Alexander and Martha Brown in LaPlata, Maryland.

And together, they were the Tuesday night team leaders for that ministry. Additionally, Nathaniel and his wife were active in the Seniors Ministry. He was a strong man of God until the end.


