## <u>Obituary</u>

Eugenia Jeanette Butler Strange, a loving mother, little sister, beloved aunt, and wonderful friend, went home to be with the Lord Jesus Christ in the early morning of February 12, 2024.

Jeanette "Jenny B." as she was lovingly known, was born to James Butler and Virginia Estelle Fenwick (neé Hill) on December 2, 1963, in Newport News, Virginia.

Jeanette grew up in Hampton and Newport News, Virginia and graduated from Bethel High School in 1982, where she participated in the Key Club and Pom Pom Squad. She was a part of a circle of friends called the "BGs" (short for "Baby Girls") who have remained friends since high school. Jeanette was, and will always be, BG #3.

After high school, Jeanette attended Virginia Union University and Norfolk State University. Jeanette later relocated to the Washington metropolitan area and began her professional career with Government Employee Insurance Company (GEICO). A bonus to her time at GEICO was meeting Bryant Strange Sr. The two became a couple and married in August 1991. Their lives were richly blessed with the births of their sons, Jesse Leonard and Bryant, Jr.

Jeanette continued her professional career at The Washington Post as an advertising coordinator where she was recognized throughout several years for her stellar customer service and contributions to international advertising accounts. Applying her passion to assist others, she also used her skills by fulfilling a position as Human Resources/Administrative Assistant for Home Instead Senior Care.

While working full-time, Jeanette went back to school and earned a bachelor's degree in Business Administration (2005) and a masters degree in business administration, with a minor in human resources (2009). Both undergraduate and graduate degrees were obtained from Strayer University.

Jenny B especially enjoyed spending time with family and friends; having recently spent a memorable fellowship on Thanksgiving Day right before her illness. Prior to the Thanksgiving gathering, she had also taken a well-deserved vacation in October with friends to Myrtle Beach. Even though her health challenges slightly slowed her pace, she was deliberate about spending weekly time out at the senior center participating in chair yoga, arts and crafts, and musical activities. Jeanette especially loved music and would often be found reminiscing about "ole skool" tunes.

Jeanette was a beautiful, funny, smart, godly woman who fought hard and loved even harder. She found spiritual fulfillment in listening to sermonic messages at First Baptist Church of Glenarden, where she was most recently a member. The Strange family also spent years as members of From the Church Heart Ministries<sub>®</sub>.

Jeanette had many titles and nicknames but the greatest to her was mom to Jesse and Bryant, Jr. They were the greatest loves of her life. She did so much with the life given and tackled the many challenges she faced.
