On Wednesday, September 18, 2024, Ida E. Harris, affectionately known as "Dollie" and "Mama Harris," answered the call to eternal life. Born on July 28, 1944, she was the second oldest of seven siblings from Layland, West Virginia, and the daughter of the late Robert and Gracie Erkhart.

In the late 1950s, Ida moved to Washington, D.C. She graduated from Eastern High School in 1962 and had an interest in nursing. Ida became a licensed practical nurse upon completing her studies at Martha Washington Vocational School in Washington, D.C. She had a long career in nursing and caregiving, spanning over 40 years. She worked at Freedmen's Hospital, DC General Hospital, Sunshine Group Home, and Marjul Homes.

Ida always stood for excellence and doing things the right way and in order. During the late 1960s, she met the love of her life, Shellie Harris, Sr., and from that union they had two sons, Shellie Jr. and Oba. She was a devoted wife and mother who would do anything for her husband, children, and family. Although she only had two biological children, she became a mother figure to hundreds of other children, teenagers, and adults.

In her early thirties, Ida re-dedicated her life to Jesus Christ. Her favorite scripture was *Proverbs 3:5-6*, "Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths."

Ida attended Third Street Church of God under the leadership of Pastor Samuel Hines. There she began working with the youth and teaching Sunday school. In 1985, the Lord Jesus Christ led Ida and her sons to From the Heart Church Ministries under the leadership of the late Dr. John A. Cherry. There, she faithfully served in the Youth Department, teaching several generations about the goodness and love of God. Additionally, she served in the Youth Against Peer Pressure Ministry until the time of her death.

Everyone who knew "Mama Harris" knew that she loved wearing hats. You would definitely see her fashionable style at church. She was a collector of many varieties and styles of hats. You also knew that she enjoyed listening to contemporary gospel songs by Fred Hammond and Commissioned. She also loved to travel. One of her most memorable trips was taken in 1998. That year, she and her son Oba visited Ghana with her From the Heart family. Thereafter, she went on several cruises and attended many of the church's women's retreats.

Ida loved sports, especially football. Her favorite professional and collegiate teams were the Washington Commanders and Alabama State University. She loved college basketball; during March Madness, she faithfully made her NCAA brackets.

Ida will be dearly missed by her family and friends, but her unconditional love, spirit, and legacy will remain in their hearts forever. She leaves to cherish her memory, her sons, Shellie Jr. and Oba (Marsha); grandchildren: Jamal, Oba Jr., and Jordane; great-grandchildren, Kaila and Soleil; sisters: Doris Erkhart -Simms, Grace Chatmon (John), Cordelia Hodges (Herman), Katie Holloway (Johnnie), and a host of other relatives, her church family, and friends.

Ida was preceded in death by her husband, Shellie Harris Sr.; sister, Jane Herring; and brother, Robert Erkhart, Jr.

Jesus knows our every weakness: Take it to the Lord in Prayer.


Are we weak and heavy laden, Cumbered with a load of care?
