Leroy D. Baker, Jr., was born on October 25, 1948, in Alexandria, Virginia, to the late Leroy and Bernice Baker. He was the oldest son of six children.

In 1965, he graduated from Parker-Gray High School, Alexandria's first high school to educate African American children. Leroy subsequently enlisted in the United States Army and proudly served his country as a private during the Vietnam War beginning in 1969.

After being honorably discharged from the military, Leroy worked for the City of Alexandria in the Traffic and Engineering Department for over 40 years. He also served as President of the Alexandria Society for the Preservation of Black Heritage beginning in 2012; and he was involved with the Alexandria Black History Museum.

Leroy had great concern for the youth in his community. He was very community-oriented, and in 1973, he was instrumental in creating the Youth Alternative Coalition, an organization designed to provide counsel and assistance to any youth who needed it. Because of his dedication to the Coalition, in February 2023, he received the Presidential Achievement Award, and to Leroy's surprise it was presented by one of the youth he had assisted years before.

As a young man, he gave his life to the Lord Jesus Christ at Third Baptist Church in Alexandria, Virginia. Leroy was a dedicated servant there.

On May 4, 1994, he married his wife, Lynda. The two have been in each other's lives for 47 years. On April 9, 2000, the lovely couple joined From the Heart Church Ministries in Maryland where they received the uncompromising Word of God. Through the teachings, they learned how to be a godly husband and wife. As they put their faith into action, their love and dedication to one another grew—and more importantly, were sustained.

Unquestionably, Leroy was a man of God who possessed a servant's heart. He was known for his consistent, constant work in the ministry, and he always did so with an abundance of joy in his heart. He served in the Physical Stewardship, Seniors, and Helps Ministries. He also assisted in Dining Services. Leroy truly served as unto the Lord. He often commented to his wife that unless he was working as hard as, Bishop John A. Cherry, II, did to bring forth the Word of God, what he was doing was not hard work. He wholeheartedly believed in giving one hundred percent effort in the service of the Lord.

Leroy will be deeply missed by those who knew and loved him. He leaves to cherish his memory, his wife, Lynda Baker; daughter, Sedena Baker; son, Nigel Baker; grandchildren: Jordan Baker, Justice Baker, Micah Baker and Tru Baker; great-grandchildren, Aubrey and Kaylee; siblings: Francine, Ronald (Renee), Eugene, Juanita, Kenneth (Patsy); brothers and sisters-in-love: Leon Johnson, Kevin Johnson (Rita), Terrance Akins and Christine Griffith (Vicente); a host of other relatives; and an abundance of brothers and sisters-in-Christ.

Leroy was preceded in death by his daughter, Takeyah Brooks.

So now our Brother-in-Love, we know that you are resting in peace, because you are now in the arms of the Lord.


