Jael Maima Miller was born on Friday, July 26, 2024, to Jerome and Nicole Miller. She went home to be with the Lord on Thursday, October 3, 2024.

Jael was the youngest child to one older brother, Jerome Miller, III. To her mom, she was known as "Baby Girl," "Star," "Precious," and "Baby Cake." To her dad, she was known as "Darlin'," "Little Lady," and "Lady J."

Jael was born at INOVA Fairfax Hospital at 25 weeks and 4 days gestation. She was born at 11:48 p.m., weighing 1 pound, 11.7 ounces, with a height of 12.3 inches. Due to her early birth, she called the tiny baby neighborhood of the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit her home. During her 69 days of life, she brought joy to everyone who cared for her. Often referred to as feisty by the staff, Jael could often be found being extra wiggly during diaper changes and other care times. She enjoyed hearing children's songs, like Twinkle Twinkle Little Star, and cuddles with mommy and daddy. Her favorite moments were being held by her parents and meeting her grandparents.

Jael will be remembered for what she taught her family. With God, all things are possible. Her parents grew to know God's grace and mercy in ways they could have never imagined. The family endured a difficult time to find strength in the life that God blessed her with. She will forever be in their hearts as they continue to learn and grow and honor her memory.


