Obituary

On October 16, 1954, Esther Magdalene Malone-Bey was born in Yonkers, New York, to the late Marion Johnson and Bernice Smith. On the evening of October 30, 2024, Esther passed away peacefully at home in Silver Spring, Maryland.

Esther was the baby of her family, being the youngest sibling to five brothers and four sisters. She graduated from Yonkers High School in 1972 where she played the fife and had an interest in model trains, soccer, and African dance. Esther went on to earn her associate degree at Sullivan Community College where she advanced her artistic skills in photography and graduated with a sociology degree.

Esther joined From the Heart Church Ministries on October 16, 2011. She was actively involved in the life of the church prior to her relocating. She was a faithful member of the Physical Stewardship Ministry.

Being a great person of service, Esther dedicated her life to helping others. She was a pharmacist shortly after high school. In the late 80s, she went on to become a manager at Roberson and Roberson, her family-owned group home for the mentally challenged. Later, she became a secretary for New Endeavors shelter for women. Finally, she worked in Early Childhood Development at the Navy District Washington Child and Youth Programs. There, Esther channeled her skills to assist children between the ages of six weeks and five years old in becoming intelligent, school-ready individuals. Even after retirement of over 25 years, she is still praised for her excellent and generous work and contacted by many of her old students who are now adults. Esther also started her own greeting card company called Esther's Customize Greetings, showing off her artistic skills and eye for graphic design.

As an avid New York Giants fan, she was most famous for her delicious peach cobbler. However, her favorite team to cheer for was her family and friends. Often giving more to others than she gave to herself, Esther was always seen in support of graduations, instrument and dance recitals, school competitions, raffles, fundraisers, sporting events, and relationships. She showed up for those she cared for, stylish, poised, graceful, and full of pride.

Esther leaves to adore her memory a devoted daughter Alexis Bostic of Concord, North Carolina, her loving sons, Alexander Bostic of Martinsburg, West Virginia and Nicholas Bostic of Baltimore, Maryland; sister, Barbara-Ann Powell of Tarrytown, Georgia; brothers, Kirkland Smith of Greenburgh, New York and Visol Smith of Vidalia, Georgia; grandchildren: Raheem Anthon, Malik Anthon, Shomari Anthon, Summer Anthon, Sydney Bostic, Caden Bostic and Cassidy Bostic; great-grandchild, Zayd Anthon; a daughter-in-law, and a host of other relatives and friends.

Esther is preceded in death by her sister, Ossie Terry and brother, Johnnie Roberson.
