

Dolores Belton Lyles, also known as "Dee," was born on August 2, 1941, in Charlotte, North Carolina, to Thomas and Ethel Broom Belton. She was the eldest of her eight siblings: Calvin Belton-Boston, Terry Belton, Moses Belton, Charles Belton, Donald Belton, Edith Carter, Dorothy Belton, and Robert Belton.

Dolores grew up in her grandparents, Moses and Ethel Belton's church, where the foundation of her faith was built and carried her through the remainder of her life. After high school, Dolores went to study early childhood education at Johnson C. Smith College in 1959 where she later met Ronald Lyles, Sr. They soon married and moved to Washington, D.C., where they completed their college degrees. From their union five children were born: Kim, Ronald Jr., Yohn, Shakhil, and Malik Lyles.

Dee began her career working for the federal government in downtown Washington, D.C., where she swiftly moved up the General Schedule pay scale. She then decided to pursue a career in teaching which became her passion and drove her to return to college at Bowie State University with a concentration of special education. She dedicated the rest of her life's work to bettering the lives of students throughout Prince George's and Charles County Maryland. She made an indelible mark on the lives of her students, and they continued to stay connected with her throughout their adulthood. She also had an impact on many of the teachers that she trained in how to run a stellar classroom. Notably, she totaled over 45 years in the school system.

Outside of school, Dolores' world revolved around her grandchildren: Ronald Lyles, Diamond Jackson, and Jasmine Lyles. She made it her duty to instill her faith, morals, and strength into them. She always brought the family together with her infamous holiday dinners at her house and trivia games that made you feel like you were right in her classroom.

After retiring in 2020, she spent her time taking care of her great-grandchildren, Lauryn and Saint, she always said, "They kept her going."

Dolores, a woman of faith, joined From the Heart Church Ministries in 1988. Prior to her health declining, she was active in the church through her committed involvement in the Altar, Physical Stewardship, Helps, and Seniors Ministries.

Moreover, she was full of life, spunk, and wit; and she never had a problem telling people what was on her mind. Her favorite activities consisted of getting dolled up for church every Sunday, and taking her granddaughter, Diamond, shopping on the weekends.

Dolores was known for her strong-willed, self-assured nature, her strong faith in her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and her wonderful passion for children and education. She fought a good fight with cancer beginning in 2019, and ending on October 25, 2024, when she peacefully transitioned. She will always be remembered for her unwavering strength, faith, resilience, and grace in the face of adversity.
