Additionally, she was the recipient of the Air Force Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Service Commendation Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal, Joint Service Achievement Medal, Air Force Achievement Medal, and various unit and service awards.

Sharon's final assignment in the military was serving at the Pentagon, a position she held with pride and dedication. It was during her time in the military that she met her husband, Sam Williams. Her years of service sparked a deep love of travel, a passion she carried with her throughout her life. Sharon retired from the military in August 2001, having served with distinction. After completing her military service, she continued her dedication to public service by working as a civil service contractor, a position she held until her retirement in June 2024.
