Oh, the joy to see you come!*

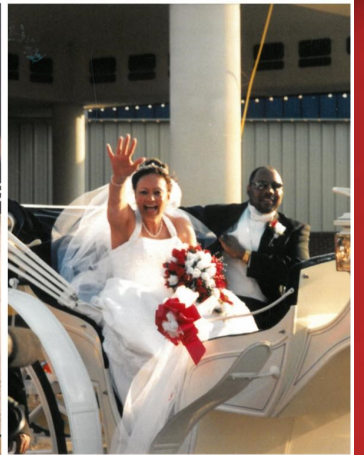
