

James "Jimi" Alexander Bethel, Jr. was born on May 2, 1947, in Goode, Virginia, to the late James Alexander Bethel, Sr. and the late Edna Harliss Dyke. He passed away peacefully in Mesa, Arizona, at the age of 77.

Jimi grew up in Goode, Virginia; however, he later moved to Washington, D.C., to be with his mother, and sister, Dolores Smith. He attended Spingarn High School, where he played football and ran track. While at Spingarn, he met his wife, Beverly James. The couple was blessed with sons, James Bethel, III and Brandon Bethel.

In the sixties, Jimi joined the Metropolitan Police Department where he honorably served for 20 years. In his spare time, he enjoyed playing golf, creating inventions, and singing with the acapella group DC's Finest, a group of active and retired D.C. police officers often referred to as "Doo Wop Cops." The singers are known locally and internationally and have received numerous accolades from their thousands of adoring fans. In the 90s and 2000s, they performed for former presidents, George H.W. Bush, Bill Clinton, and George W. Bush. Additionally, they sang at the Pentagon for the former Secretary of State, Colin Powell. After the release of their album Arresting Sounds in 1995, they continued to perform with, or open for artists such as Stevie Wonder, Bobby Womack, Eddie Holman, and the Dells. One of Jimi's most cherished performances was having the honor to sing at the inauguration of the Buffalo Soldier Monument in Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, in 1992.

In 1993 Jimi joined From the Heart Church Ministries where he received the uncompromising Word of God. He relocated to Arizona in 2018 and maintained his membership as a satellite member.

Jimi lived a life filled with love, kindness, and generosity—touching the hearts of all who knew and loved him. He will be deeply missed. Jimi leaves to cherish his memory, his wife, Larmie Mickens; children, James Bethel, III and Brandon Bethel; daughter-in-law, Nancy Bethel; stepchildren: Cecil Kent Mickens, III, Aaron Joshuah Mickens, and Amanda Danie Mickens; grandchildren: Alison, Olivia, and Ayden Mickens; niece, Karen; his great-nieces and nephews; and a host of other family and friends.


