<u>Obiluary</u>

On Friday, January 24, 2025, Melba Evans made a peaceful transition to eternal life. She was born Melba Easterling on March 28, 1941, in Mobile, Alabama, to the late Curtis Easterling and Katherine Russell Easterling.

It was discovered through a cousin that Melba was musically inclined, and she began piano lessons at the age of 5. She excelled in her musical skills, and by age 9, after dedicating her life to Jesus Christ, Melba led her first children's choir at her local church in Mobile. This was the beginning of a lifelong passion for music. Over the years, she served as a church musician and music teacher, playing at various churches and civic events. She served at over 2,000 documented homegoing services and taught over 300 students from 5 to 80 years old, leaving a lasting impact on the musical community.

In 1954, she relocated to Gary, Indiana, to complete her high school years at Roosevelt High School. She had an adventurous and humorous spirit with hobbies she shared with her favorite cousin, Willie "Dick" Floyd Russell, which included motorcycle riding (Harley Davidson 350) for over 60 years, drag car racing in Indiana, and occasionally helping her uncle, Willie Floyd, Sr., drive 18-wheeler transit trucks for his business.

As a young person, Melba was active in the civil rights movement in Alabama, accompanying her mother and grandmother, Laura Katherine Russell, to historic events like Bloody Sunday on the Emmett Pettus Bridge in 1965, the March on Washington, and the lunch counter sit-ins in Mobile. Taught to be active in the civil rights movement, she had the opportunity to attend the historic event of Emmett Till's funeral with her best friend, Addie Rose Dunlap, in Chicago and served as an alternate musician. She graduated from Gary Roosevelt in 1958, continuing her musical studies at Indiana University Bloomington in music education, and acquired the ability to play 37 instruments with a concentration in organ. During her time at Gary Roosevelt, she met William Powell Garrett; the two shared a joint interest in piano. In 1960, they married while in college, and one daughter, Darmita Garrett, was born to their union.

After college, Melba continued her studies in music and metalogical sciences. She was employed at Inland Steel Corporation as a metalogical scientist. In 1987, she married Carey Evans of Ohio at Prayer House of Faith Church, where she served as the church choir director for 25 years.

Melba retired from Inland after 27 years of service in 1997 to move to Maryland to be close to her family and grandchildren. Melba joined From the Heart Church Ministries in 1997, taught music at From the Heart Christian School, and served in the Music Ministry, playing at homegoing services and church events. She also continued playing the organ for other churches and ministries in the Washington metropolitan area.

Melba was a loving and devoted mother and grandmother, always serving her family. Her grandchildren were the light of her life. She will be dearly missed by all who knew and loved her. Melba leaves to cherish her memory her daughter, Darmita Garrett Wilson of Bangor, Maine; bonus daughters, Antionette Green of Maryland, and Lane Garrett Henderson-Mainor of Michigan; grandchildren: Rebekah Wilson of New York, Renata Wilson of London, England, and Paul M. Wilson, II of Maryland; bonus granddaughter, Faith Jiles; nephews and niece: Michael Brazier, Newman Brazier, and Vivian Williams of Alabama; cousins: Sandy (Samuel, Sr.) Cook of Maryland, Jane (Gregory, Sr.) Reed Martin-Calhoun of Georgia, Carmen, Lawrence, Marlon Russell, and Tracy Russell Youngblood of Indiana; and a host of other relatives, friends, and students.

Melba was preceded in death by her sister, Thelma Brazier, and nephew, Bruce Easterling.


Our Dearest Melba,
