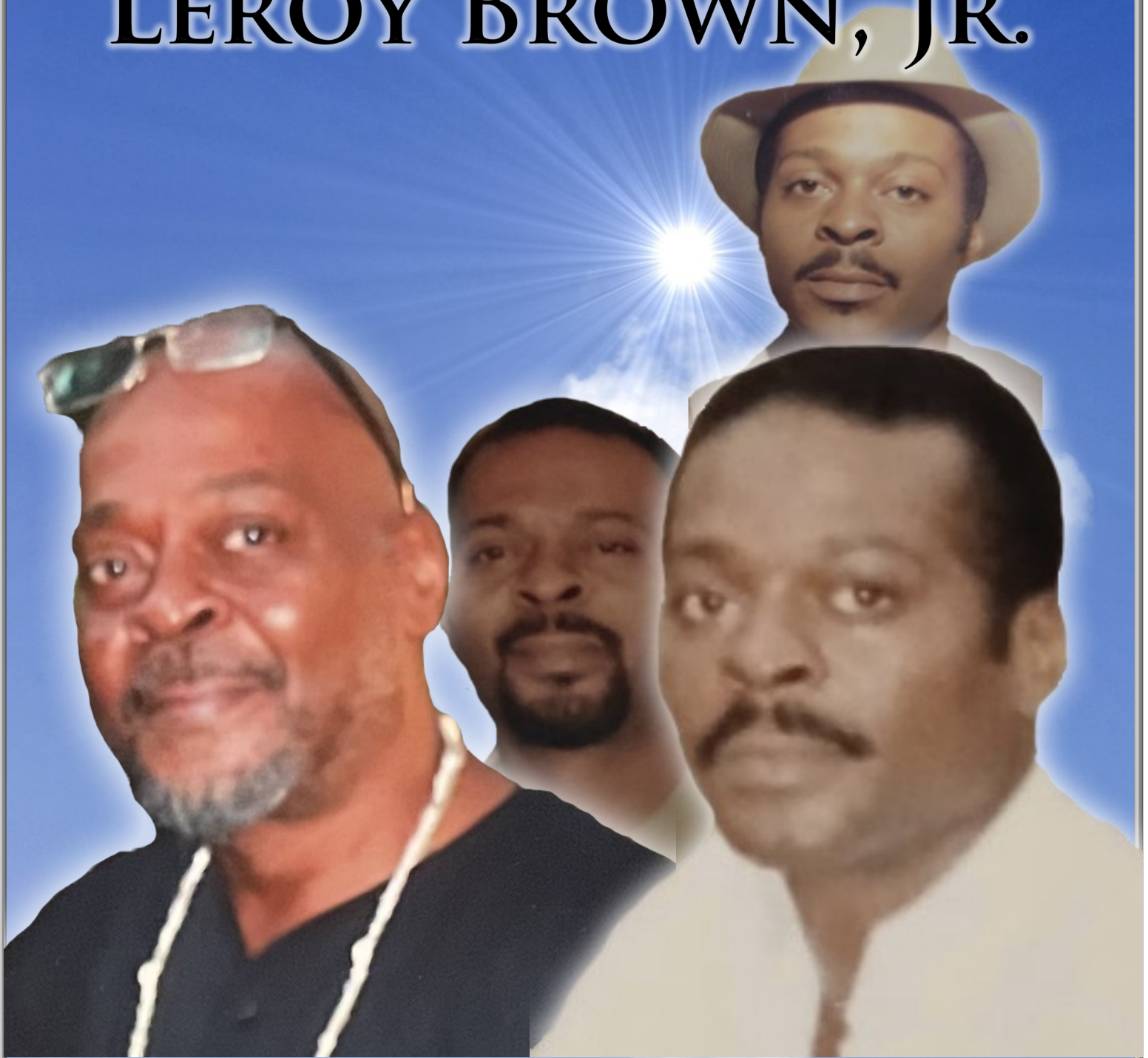

# OBITUARY

**Leroy Brown, Jr.** was born on December 30, 1959, to Leroy and Judy Brown. He grew up in Washington, D.C., with his five siblings.

A proud grandfather, his face would light up whenever he saw or spoke of his grandchildren. He enjoyed football season and could not wait to watch his favorite team, the Washington Commanders—always hoping for a win, and fussing and yelling at the television when they did not score a touchdown. Nevertheless, he was a die-hard fan.

Leroy will be dearly missed by all who knew and loved him.
