and making sure that we give our best to make their journey comfortable.*

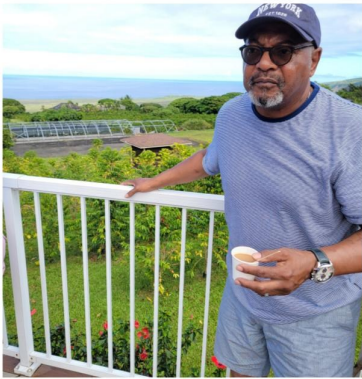
*The mystery of this fabulous journey is;
