# OBITUARY

**Gloria Nichol Morrison**, affectionately known as “Glo,” was born on December 30, 1984, to Edwin and Joanne Morrison at Malcolm Grow Medical Hospital on Joint Base Andrews. She was raised in Fort Washington, Maryland, and was the youngest of three children.

Gloria received her education in the Prince George’s County Public Schools, graduating from Friendly High School in 2002. While there, she was a dedicated cadet in the Junior Reserved Officers Training Corps program and an active member of the drill team. From a young age, she pursued martial arts with passion, earning a black belt from Jhoon Rhee Tae Kwon Do, one of the most respected martial arts systems in the world. By age 19, she had achieved a 2nd degree black belt and became an instructor herself. Gloria later earned professional certifications in sheet metal and Heating, Ventilation, and Air Conditioning, eventually rising to the role of foreman—a testament to her determination, drive, and commitment to excellence.

Gloria accepted Jesus Christ in her life and joined From the Heart Church Ministries in 2000, inspiring many of her friends to do the same. She cherished time with family and friends by finding joy in life’s simple pleasures—playing billiards, cheering on her beloved Dallas Cowboys, and spending time playing a lively game of spades. She was an excellent cook, best known for steaming live crabs and preparing her signature crab sauce that everyone loved.

Gloria’s radiant smile, generous spirit, and infectious laugh touched everyone she met. She will be remembered for her kindness, loyalty, and the joy she brought to every gathering.

Gloria leaves to cherish her memory, her mother, Joanne Morrison-Ulmer (Devern); sister, Lisa Morrison; sister-in-law, Allison Wise (surrogate brother, Darius); nieces, Jameka Anderson, Brianna Darnaby (Jessie Tickles), and Amirah Minor (Marcus); honorary son, Shayne Howard; and a host of other relatives and friends.

Gloria was preceded in death by her father, Edwin Morrison, in 1999; her brother, Maurice Darnaby, in 2006; and her beloved grandmother and namesake, Gloria Flood, in 2015.

It’s how she showed her love so much.

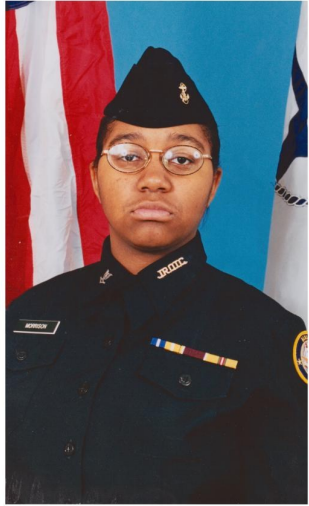
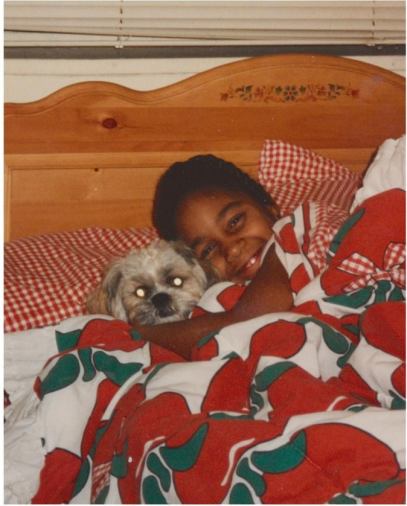
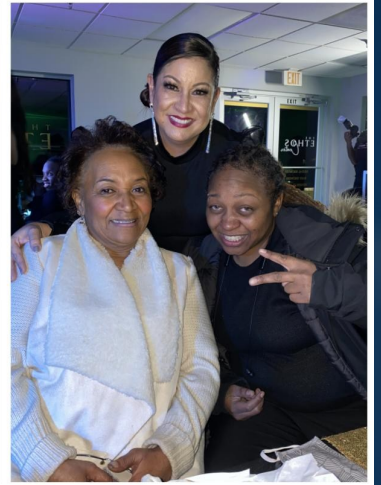
Her hands could cook, her heart could heal,
