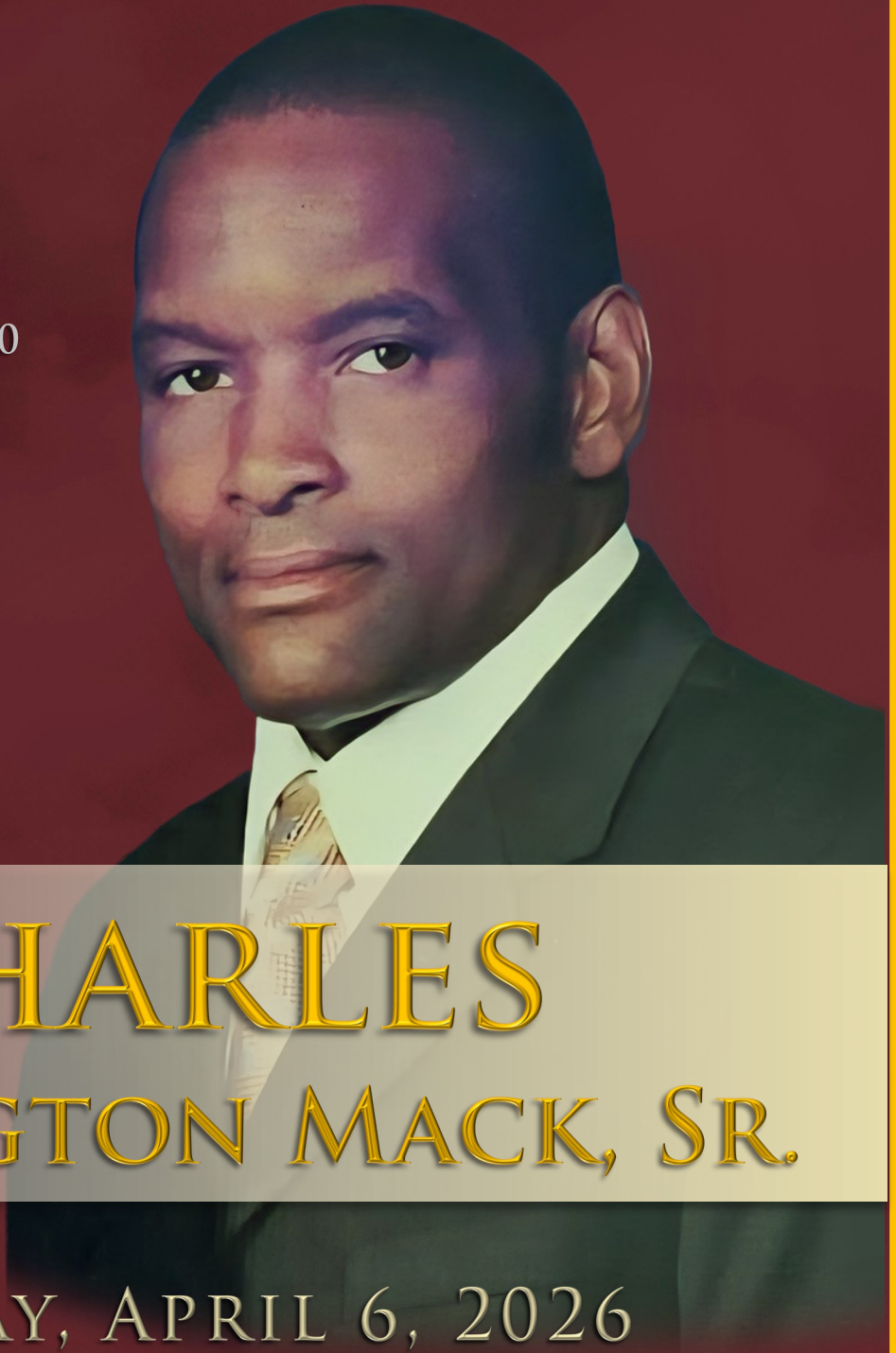

Amazing Grace

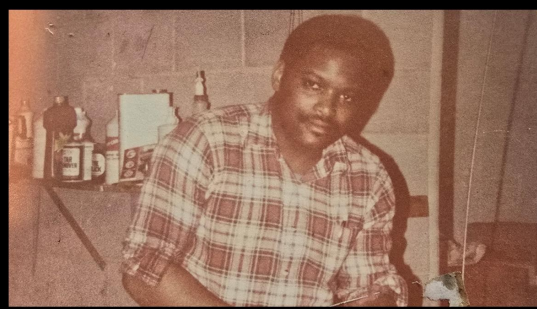
*Amazing grace! How sweet the sound, that saved a wretch like me!
