Obituary

Joyce Williams Hui was born in Washington, D.C., on November 9, 1956, to the late Clarence Sr. and the late Catherine Williams. She was the oldest of six children, a role she carried with love, strength, and responsibility throughout her life.

We are here today to celebrate and honor the life of **Joyce Williams Hui**, wife, sister, aunt, friend—a woman whose heart was as generous as her smile, whose faith was unwavering, and whose love for her family and friends was boundless.

Joyce was educated in the District of Columbia Public Schools. She attended Golding Elementary School, Browne Junior High School, and Spingarn High School, and afterward furthered her education at the University of Maryland. From an early age, Joyce demonstrated the wisdom, grace, and compassion that would become the hallmark of her life.

Joyce was a giving person in every sense of the word. She loved her husband, Jonathan, her family, and everyone who crossed her path. Joyce had a true gift for making life beautiful—whether through her impeccable fashion sense, her exquisite home décor, or her incredible cooking. She never hesitated to share her wisdom—and, of course, a little laughter along the way.

Speaking of laughter, Joyce's siblings shared a running joke with her. Whenever they went out to eat, she would order her food, return it, taste theirs, then shake her head, and say, "Why didn't I order that too?" That mischievous smile and her playful spirit were uniquely Joyce.

She began her professional career with the federal government at the U.S. Department of State. She later devoted her talents and compassion to several nonprofit organizations before faithfully serving on staff at From the Heart Church Ministries, in both the Multimedia Department and Dining Services. Joyce pursued her entrepreneurial spirit by starting her own catering business, where she shared one of her most beloved gifts—her cooking. She became especially well known for her Motisola vegetarian chili, a dish made with the same warmth and love she poured into everything she did.

Joyce was a Christian from a young age and wanted everyone to know Jesus. In 1991, she joined From the Heart, a church she loved, and volunteered in the Community Outreach, Singles, Multimedia, and New Converts Ministries, and on occasion assisted the Fine Arts Ministry in various skits. She extended her outreach from the East to the West Coast, where she joined Calvary Chapel East Anaheim, Anaheim, CA. She was always seeking to guide youth toward Christ—always sharing God's love.

Moreover, Joyce's heart was full of faith. She trusted God with her desires and waited faithfully for the husband she hoped for. Her marriage brought her family so much joy, as they celebrated her dream fulfilled, a testament to her steadfast faith. She believed deeply that God honors those who remain holy and patient, and she lived that truth every day. Her faith was not just personal, it was active, vibrant, and shared.

Joyce loved her family fiercely. She was a mother figure to her siblings—their protector, their guide, and their “Sister Mom.” Her care for them extended beyond duty; it came from a heart full of love. Similarly, when you met Joyce, you were embraced by one of her favorite greetings, “Girly Girl,” “Honey,” etc. She had a warmth that drew people in, and she will be remembered for her radiant smile, her love for God, her gift of hospitality, her vegetarian chili, and her gift of prophecy—telling the truth in love. She encouraged others to live fully in Jesus Christ, reminding them that God's love is for everyone.

Today, we mourn the loss of Joyce, but we also celebrate her life—one of generosity, faith, laughter, service, and beauty. She leaves behind a legacy that will continue in every heart she touched, in every life she guided, and in every smile she shared.

Joyce leaves to cherish her memory, her devoted husband, Jonathan Hui; sons-in-love, Brandon and Preston; sister, Karen (John) Pierce; brothers, Antonio Williams and Sean (Patricia) Williams; nieces: Rachal, Malachi, Noah, and Steicy; and a host of other loving family members and dear friends whose lives were forever touched by her love and kindness.

She was preceded in death by her sister, Luci Williams-Houston, and brother, Clarence Williams, Jr.

This woman who gave more, she knew that everything was measured,

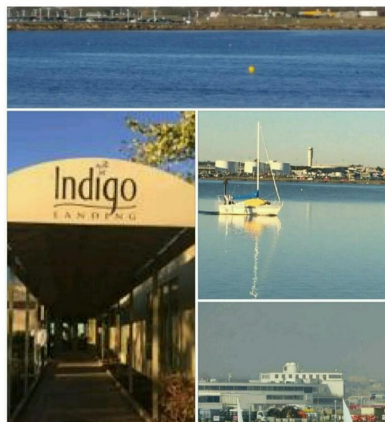
Because of Christ and His love.

The memories she leaves will heal, for peace to be still.

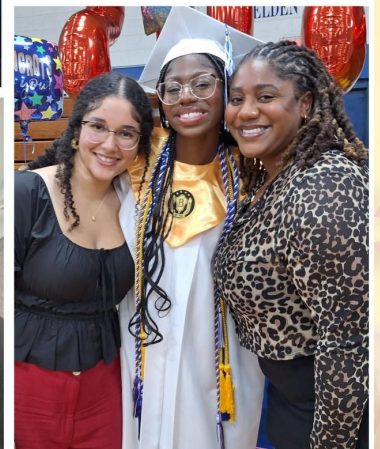

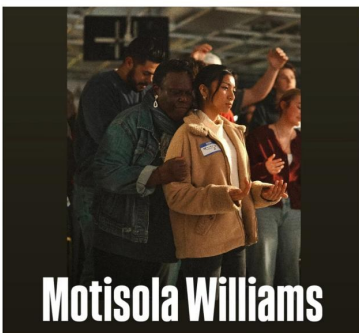
