Fay Terresa Yancy-Wiggins, 65, of Fort Bend County, Texas, passed away peacefully on Friday, July 17, 2026, surrounded by her loving family. Born on August 9, 1960, in Cleveland, Ohio, within Cuyahoga County, she was the third daughter of James Kenneth Yancy and Marion Lucille Yancy.

Fay graduated from John F. Kennedy High School in 1978 and subsequently obtained both a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and a Master of Business Administration from DeVry University. Over her lifetime, she held numerous roles in administration. Notably, through her persistence, Fay dedicated more than 50 years to the workforce and proudly supported the female professional community through Dress for Success; her tenacity to help others was deeply embedded in all of her actions.

In 2020, Fay joined From the Heart Church Ministries in Suitland, Maryland. She was an active satellite member who faithfully served in the Intercessory Prayer Ministry.

She loved the music of Michael Jackson and Earth, Wind & Fire, attending social events with friends and caring for her beloved pets. During her time on Earth, she adopted and deeply spoiled multiple pets, including Buster, Bluey, Star, Beauty, Einstein and Emerald.

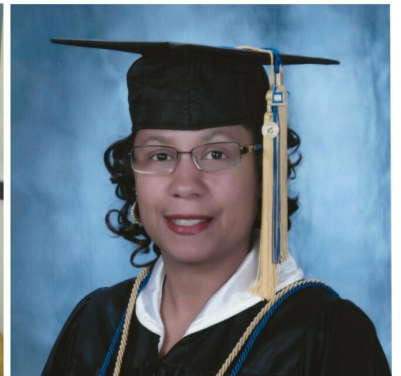
To My Sister...
